

Learning to Think Things Through: A Guide to Success in High School (Incoming 9th graders only)

This course focuses on ways to help prepare for a successful high school experience. High School Success is an opportunity for incoming freshmen to learn about the demands and expectations of h.s. courses in a relaxed environment. Math SAT Success

Incoming Grades: 10-12

Verbal SAT Success

Incoming Grades: 10-12

This course is designed to target the four major areas that the Verbal SAT assesses: Vocabulary, critical reading, grammar and writing. Through instructional sessions and practice exercises, students will gain confidence and test-taking strategies that are essential for success on the SAT.
